EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 2025-02

CONTRACT WITH CLARK COUNTY FOR DISPATCH SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Village of Tremont City requires efficient and reliable emergency dispatch services to ensure the safety and well-being of its residents; and

WHEREAS, Clark County, Ohio, has the necessary resources, personnel, and infrastructure to provide such dispatch services in a cost-effective and professional manner; and

WHEREAS, an immediate contract is necessary to protect public safety and ensure uninterrupted emergency response services; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code and the authority vested in the Village Council, it is determined that entering into an agreement with Clark County is in the best interest of the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF TREMONT CITY, OHIO:

SECTION 1: The Village of Tremont City is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Clark County, Ohio, for the provision of dispatch services.

SECTION 2: This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, and safety. Accordingly, it shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4: That all prior ordinances or resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

VILLAGE OF TREMONT CITY POLICE 2025 DISPATCHING AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Village is desirous of acquiring law enforcement dispatching for the residents of **The Village of Tremont City**, Clark County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into this agreement as part of the allocation of costs for the county public safety answering point and final 9-1-1 plan.

NOW THEREFORE, the Sheriff agrees to provide twenty-four (24) hour per day dispatching services to the Village's Police Agency. Dispatching shall be limited to the Police Chief and their commissioned law enforcement personnel responding for the Police Agency and any associated LEADS / NCIC inquiries, entries or confirmations. The Sheriff also agrees to assist in the communication between the Village and other units, which may be available to provide assistance or backup.

The parties agree to the following:

- 1. The Sheriff shall not be responsible for any administrative or operating decisions, as it relates to the responding Village Police agency.
- 2. The Sheriff's responsibility shall be limited to relaying the request for services to the appropriate Village Police agency via the FCC assigned radio frequency or via mobile data terminal.
- 3. It is agreed that additional communication may be needed to ensure safety of law enforcement personnel and the public.
- 4. Each party agrees to be responsible for any negligent acts or negligent omissions by or through itself or its officers, employees, agents and contracted servants, and each party further agrees to defend itself and themselves and pay any judgments and costs arising out of such negligent acts or negligent omissions, and nothing in this agreement shall impute or transfer any such responsibility from one to the other.
- 5. Pursuant to Ohio law,

- (1) That, in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under the contract or any subcontract, neither the contractor nor any subcontractor, by reason of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry, shall discriminate against any citizen of this state in the employment of a person qualified and available to perform the work to which the contract relates; and
- (2) That neither the contractor nor any subcontractor, nor any person acting on behalf of the contractor or any subcontractor, in any manner, shall discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate against any employee hired for the performance of work under the contract on account of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability or military status as defined in section 4112.01 of the Revised Code, national origin, or ancestry.

In consideration of the foregoing services to be provided by the Sheriff to the Village, the Village agrees to pay to the County the sum of \$5.50 a call but not to exceed a \$1,000 for dispatching services received for 2025, for costs incurred by the Sheriff for such services.

Payment pursuant to this agreement shall be made to the Clark County Treasurer and credited to the 911 Dispatching Fund. All monies credited to such account and not obligated at the termination of this agreement shall be credited to the County General Fund.

Payment shall be due, as described: Shall be invoiced around December 1, 2025.

The Sheriff or Village may terminate this agreement prior to the above date by supplying to the other party a sixty (60) day written notice of termination.
